

Parent Aide Logic Model (sample)

The short- and long-term outcomes for the Parent Aide program are shown below. The problem addressed by the Parent Aide model is children at-risk for abuse and neglect in families. Through the implementation of the Parent Aide model, the short-term outcomes can be achieved – these are increased protective factors of: parenting skills and attitudes, social support, and family functioning. The Parent Aide intervention also indirectly seeks to decrease risk factors of: intimate partner violence, parental depression, and parental stress. The long-term goal is children who are safe from abuse and neglect.
